



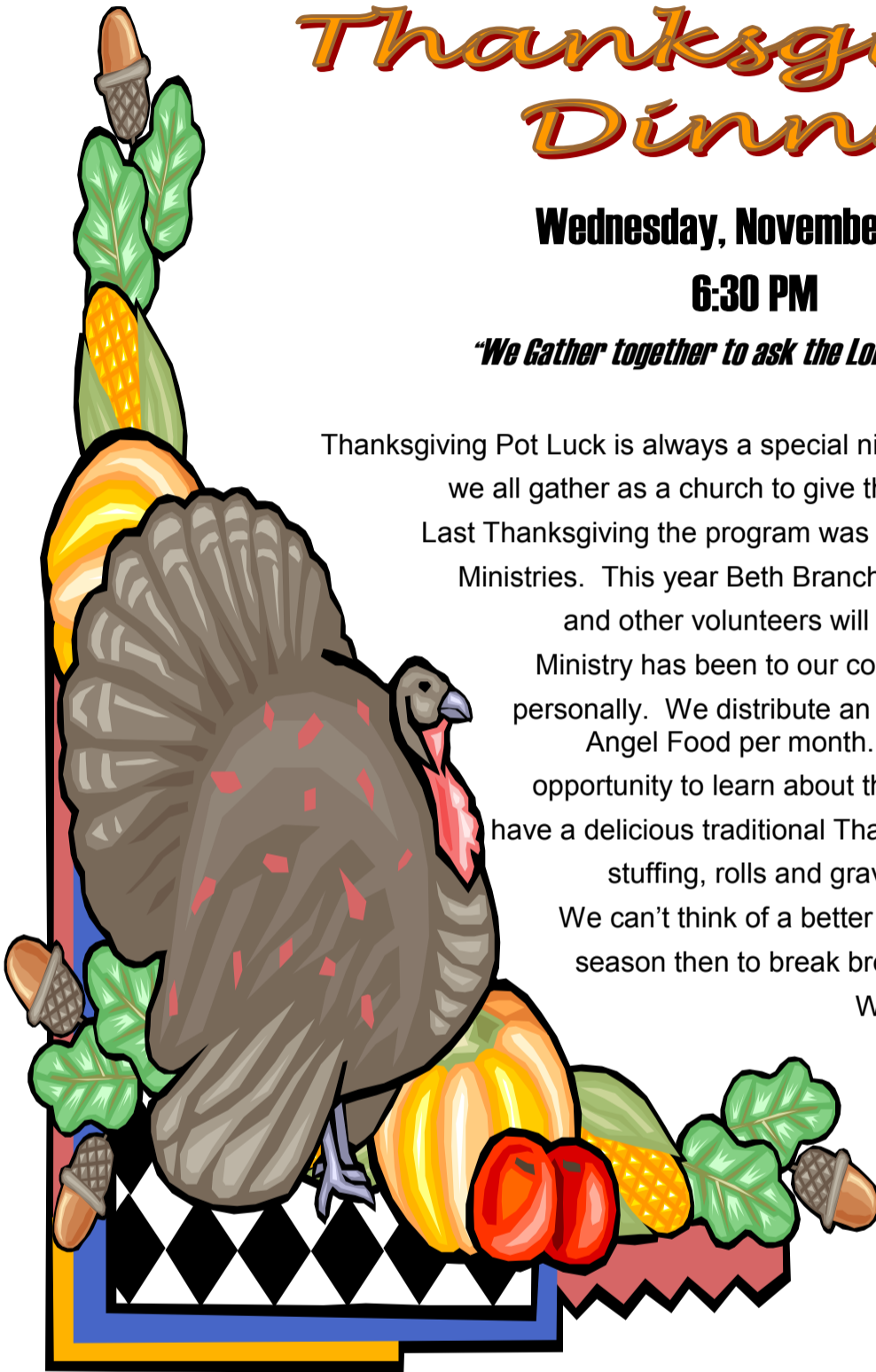

Included in the most recent issue of *The Christian Century* is a Century Mark entitled, "Big Heart." The Century Mark reads,

"Philanthropy is usually measured by the size of the material resources given away. On that basis, Bill Gates and Warren Buffett are the greatest philanthropists of all time. But Richard B. Gunderman says material resources are not the sole or the most important route to human flourishing and concludes: 'If intangible resources are more important than tangible ones, then generosity of spirit is more important than generosity of pocketbook.'" (*We Make a Life by What We Give*, Indiana University Press).

Generosity starts in the heart. It is not something that can be forced upon someone. It is not something that can be cultivated over night. It is not something that can be quantified. MARY'S WELLNESS CORNER

November is American Diabetes Month! Diabetes affects over 16 million Americans. Diabetes Mellitus is a chronic disease, in which the body does not produce enough of the Insulin hormone, or does not use it effectively, to control the amount of glucose (sugar) in the blood. There are primarily two major types of diabetes.

Type I (Insulin Dependent) diabetes occurs when the pancreas fails to make enough Insulin. Insulin must be injected every day in order to control the amount of glucose in the blood. This type of diabetes usually occurs during childhood and adolescence, but can occur at any time.

Type II (Non-Insulin dependent) diabetes occurs when the body cells resists insulin and thus reduces the amount of glucose that can be used by the cells. Because this resistance builds up over time, the symptoms of this type of diabetes are subtle and easily overlooked. Type II diabetes is more common among adults. Ten years ago Type II diabetes was unheard of among children, but it has begun to emerge as the obesity epidemic has exploded. Unless children are educated to eat a healthy diet and take up physical activity, the number of children with the condition will continue to increase.

Type I and Type II diabetes share four common symptoms: increased thirst, increased hunger, frequent urination, and fatigue. These symptoms plus weight loss, occurring suddenly, may indicate Type I diabetes. Since Type II diabetes develops over time, subtle symptoms may be; dry, itchy skin, numbness of hands or feet, frequent infections, blurred vision, slow healing cuts or sores. If you do experience any of these symptoms, have a family history of diabetes, are overweight, or have high blood pressure, do consult your physician.

Presently there is no known prevention for Type I diabetes; therefore, Insulin must be administered. You can reduce your risk for Type II, and control both Type I and Type II, through blood sugar monitoring, weight control, a sensible diet, and regular exercise.

November Wellness Tips

BODY: Eat Healthy, Take the Stairs, Park in the last row of the parking lot, Know your numbers: Check your blood sugar, It is flu season, so wash your hands and keep them away from your eyes, nose and mouth.

MIND: Visit a museum, Exercise your mind with crossword puzzles and books, Keep a file of those things that inspire you, Count your blessings.

SPIRIT: Express gratitude often, Savor all good things, Think of we and us instead of me and mine, Offer to help someone else, envision yourself reaching a goal, Call a family member.

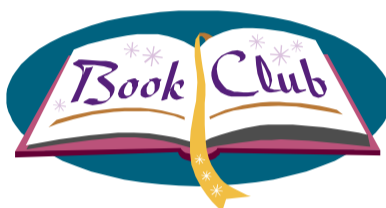

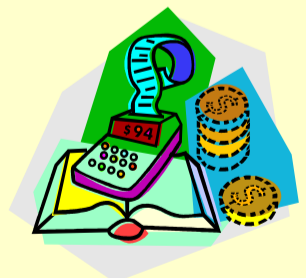

NOTE: We continue to struggle to meet our monthly expenses. I was not able to pay all of our October expenses this month. We are only averaging about \$3,000 per Sunday when we need to collect \$4,700 to meet our budgeted expenses for 2009. We are currently two months behind in our DMF missions giving and two months behind in our commitment to Oasis and Portsmouth Volunteers for the Homeless.

Building Fund has not supported itself for the last three months. The collections for the September 15th, October 15th and the November 15th payment were short. Funds from the General Fund had to be used to make the monthly payment of \$1,145.49. Good news, we were given a Gift of \$2,000 to go towards the principal balance of the mortgage that will be in-

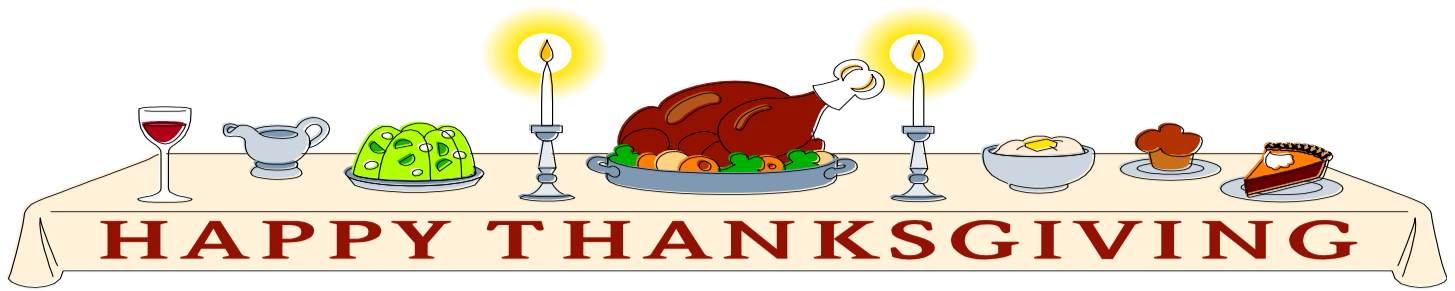
